

Re: Mission to Liberia

Dear Friend:

Did you know that Liberia had two civil wars over a period of 14 years? Over 200,000 were killed and thousands of women and children were raped, amputated, demoralized and cannibalized. **The orphans are the forgotten, needy and traumatized who so desperately need our help.**

Liberia had one of the bloodiest wars in world history. In addition to destroying thousands of lives the war destroyed infrastructure and resulted in the collapse of social and political order and therefore threatening the livelihood of an entire population.

“During the war the children just started coming to me, some didn’t know where their parents were, some had been shot and needed medical care, I took care of them.” Mother Victoria

Fresh Anointing Christian Center and New Hope Mission are working together to serve Liberia through Orphan Care, Church Leadership Development and Education.

Fresh Anointing Christian Center is a non-traditional interdenominational church of believers whose mission is to provide a total, holistic Christian Church experience that is spiritual and practical for the building of individuals and families and the strengthening of communities as set forth by the Lord Jesus Christ. We accomplish this mission through a variety of ministries to serve the needs of individuals in the Body of Christ and the community at large. For further information – <http://www.thefacc.org>.

We have partnered with and are a spiritual covering for the New Hope Missions; a network of 47 churches, a mission, a school and two orphanages under the direction of Bishop Tubman Sarpee. The New Hope Mission has a goal to sow the Seed of Hope from the Word of God, in the hearts of many in Liberia and throughout Africa. In the context of war trauma, ignorance, disease and poverty they care for orphans, train generational church leaders and educate.

In March 2012 we took a team of 14 people to Liberia to see the school, orphanages, mission and churches; we were able to assess and begin to meet the many needs of the people. This trip was life changing and we returned with a passion to help to these wonderful, resilient people.

Our current objective is to gather financial support in order to:

- Care for the children in an orphanage, that we have adopted
- Meet critical needs
- Develop a future leaders
- Equip local pastors
- Construct educational facilities

Liberia has a 6 months rainy season and one of the orphanages has serious flooding issues, flooding their living quarters where some children just have mattresses on the floor.			
\$2,500	One time to buy 50 cement bags, two sand trucks, one truck of crush rocks and steel rods to plaster the ground and make drainage before April 15 th 2012.	x	
\$1,500	To build the road to the mission property to enable us to work more effectively and efficiently. Currently cars and trucks are not able get to the school and mission.	x	
\$100	Adopt a church, many of the church buildings are in very poor condition		x
\$250	Will purchase and ship a barrel that we will send monthly with collected clothing, shoes, blankets, school and medical supplies, toiletries and reference and training materials for the Pastors.		x
\$17,000	There is great need for an African Bible Training Center to train pastors and Christian Leaders. It would be built on the Mission property.		x
\$45,000	There is a need for a Christian High School to expand the school to higher grades with 7-12 . We need to build an eight class room building at a very low cost on the mission property		x
\$47,000	We also need to build a guest house, we plan to have short term missions teams going on a regular basis to train teachers, evangelize, train the pastors, do building projects to fix and improve, to hold services, graduations and so forth so we will need housing that is inexpensive and yet honor their sacrifice. The guest house would lodge 20 missionaries at one time. This is more economical than renting expensive hotels in Liberia and transporting the team back and forth.	x	

We are also in need of used cars and trucks in good condition; you will receive a tax deductible receipt. All cars must be a Japanese model (Nissan, Toyota, Honda etc.) There is a lack of spare parts for American cars.

Financial Integrity

This is a small Christian organization with no red tape in the organizational structure. Your money goes directly, quickly and specifically where you request. You will receive a receipt for tax purposes. Everyone in the leadership is volunteering their time and sacrificing to give to the cause. The funds go through the Fresh Anointing Christian Center, or to the New Hope Mission, both are valid, U.S. non-profit 501 c3 organizations. It is sent to Edwina Beah, the Treasurer of the New Hope Mission who then distributes it to the Mission, school, orphanages or the churches as indicated. Bishop Sarpee is in constant contact and travels at least twice a year to Liberia.

Boards and Executives

Tubman Sarpee presently serves as Executive Director/President of New Hope Mission, Inc. It is a U. S. nonprofit 501c3 Christian organization serving in Liberia, headquartered in Philadelphia with a seven member Board of Directors from three local churches.

Bishop Tubman oversees 47 of the New Hope Mission Network Churches in Liberia. He is originally from Ceedor Township, Sinoe County in Liberia. He earned a Bachelor degree in Theology from Sierra Leone Bible College 1988 a M. A. in Urban Mission from Westminster Theological Seminary Philadelphia 2003. He is an ordained bishop of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, has preached the gospel from 1983 to present, both across West Africa and the United States of America. He has spent more than 23 years planting and pastoring churches in Africa and the U.S. and has a burden to establish Bible training centers in Africa to train generational leaders. He brings the redemptive message of Jesus Christ to two orphanages under his care. He is the author of, "5 Keys to Effective Prayer". Pastor Sarpee, have dedicated his life to raising up well equipped ministers in Africa.

Edwina Beah is a born again Christian and a general secretary of the Gates of Heaven church, Pastor Rev. Mother Edith Ricks in Congo town Monrovia, Liberia. Ms. Edwina was elected by the New Hope Mission board in Liberia as the treasurer; she is an accounting student at the Catholic University in Monrovia. She has experience in accounting and record keeping. She has served in this position for over a year and has brought pride to the organization during our last year audit.

Background Information

New Hope Mission Network Church's Role in Liberia

New Hope Mission (“NHM”) network of churches in Liberia is an association of independent churches working actively together to overcome conflict and engage in building peace. Churches are promoting inter-tribal dialogue, implementing peace education programs, assisting conflict victims, and contributing to peace advocacy with the government and other civil society groups, as needed.

Our Vision

The vision of the NHM churches network is to be a supporting network of urban and rural churches and rural community development in Liberia.

Our Mission

- Bringing (lay and clergy together) who have a passion for enhancing the quality of life in rural communities
- Create opportunities for members to support one another as they connect the gospel and rural life in their various contexts.
- Building mission-minded churches to shape the move of the church from tradition to Apostolic by creating an Apostolic Council in the land with the Chief Apostle residing in the USA (the covering for New Hope Mission)
- “Going for Growth!”- Conduct a yearly Strategic conference on apostolic & prophetic restoration
- Planting sound bible training school with an Apostolic edge to help cut through dark hearts and minds filled with war trauma and deep seated from the war.
- Establish a weekly prayer and intercession called “The Gap.”

Note: all these churches are self governing, self propagating and self supporting. NHM does not interfere in the internal affairs of these churches unless we are invited.

History of the Victoria Thomas Orphanages

Civil war in Liberia, AIDS, and a famine has created a crisis: children without a families. As part of the New Hope Mission, Pastor Tubman has opened an orphanage and elementary school for about 125 children in two locations (see details below).

Mother Victoria Thomas losted her husband and two grown children (girl/boy) to the war. During the heat of the war unaccompanied children were everywhere (old shipping containers, market places, beaches and street corners). With the death of her children Mother Victoria Thomas developed a strong passion to take in some of these unaccompanied children into her two bedroom shack. These children were malnourished and stricken with malaria.

Pastor Tubman at the time was working for the United Nations Children Fund (UNICEF) and was directly responsible for developing programs for trauma children in internally displaced centers and orphanages (counseling, recreation, and placement). Mother Victoria Thomas orphanage was disqualified to receive assistance because at the time she did not meet the standard set by the U.N.

She had severely war affected children in her care but lacked the facility to properly host them. She asked Pastor Sarpee to pray along with her for the Lord to provide for these children. After two months she decided to bring the orphanage under the covering of New Hope Mission. The following year Tubman moved on to work for a Christian NGO called “Association of Evangelicals of Liberia” (AEL). Tubman

became the first Relief Director responsible to distribute food from World Relief Canada and World Relief USA to Refugees, internally displaced people's centers, and orphanages.

At this time AEL provided food and assistance for the children at the orphanage. The orphanage continues to be under the supervision and covering of New Hope Mission up to present. And by the grace of God all that has been accomplished was by faith in Christ alone.
